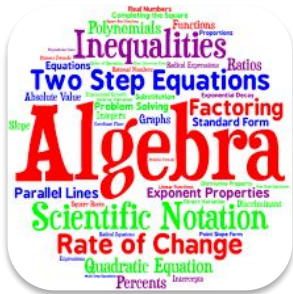

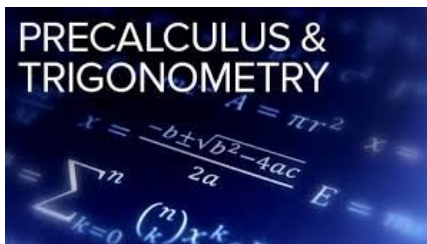



Academic teachers will place seniors into the next level class. Keep in mind that Honors, AP, Design & Level 3 or 4 foreign language classes require a teacher recommendation. Therefore, seniors will not be able to select these classes. It is recommended that seniors continue their academic classes, particularly taking a fourth year of math and science.

### \*\* SETTING SUB-PRIORITIES:

Sub priorities let the guidance department know what classes you wish to have scheduled in “priority order.” Selections must be set as 1, 2, 3 and the priority number may NOT be used twice. In the example above, CERAMICS (sub-priority 1) is the first class that system will attempt to schedule. If there is a conflict in creating the schedule, 20th CENTURY CONFLICTS (sub-priority 2) will be tried. Students should select and set 3 sub-priority electives in order to create a complete schedule, with courses of their choosing.
